Dear Honourable Minister,

We are the Ghana Chinese Chamber of Commerce. The case concerning the equity dispute over the shareholding of Chinese' s wholly-owned company in Ghana, Big Stone Mining Company Limited, is currently under trial in the High Court of Ghana. However, on August 18, 2022, the plaintiff Shanhong WAN, Ms. Magee, used political influences and colluded with some police officers to take separate action to occupy the factory, drive away Chinese employees, prevent the local employees from normal production and work, and meanwhile pry the doors and pick the locks to search rooms one by one. So far, it is not yet clear about the situation of the specific property damage and financial losses. We, as the China General Chamber of Commerce, are deeply shocked and outraged! We believe that Ghana is a sovereign country ruled by law. Chinese companies come to Ghana for investment and construction, which helps local economic development, increases tax revenue, and increases the employment rate of local employees. Therefore, the local judicial system should protect the basic rights of our Chinese companies and the personal safety of Chinese employees as well as the employment needs of the local employees.

We hope that the Ministry of Justice and Attorney General, the Chief Justice and the Ghana Police Service can take the fairness and impartiality of the law as the criterion, resolutely crack down on illegal acts and also give justice to business operators, give foreign investors the confidence to invest and start businesses in Ghana, and defend the dignity of Ghana' s law and the country.
