# PARTICULARS OF DEFAMATION INDORSED PURSUANT TO ORDER 57 RULE 2 G. 47

- a. That on the 7th of May, 2024, the Defendant published an article titled "Transport Minister his wife dragged to court for 'land grabbing' using state security" on its website, The Law Platform.
- b. That in the said publication, the following defamatory statements were made of the Plaintiff and his wife;
  - "Transport Minister and his wife dragged to court for 'land grabbing' using state security"

    "The Minister for transport and his wife Mrs Wilhemina Asiamah are due for court on Thursday, the 9th of May, 2024 for unlawfully entering and trespassing on land located at the prime and much sought after Tse Addo residential enclave".
- c. That the said statement by the Defendant is about an ongoing land matter which the Plaintiff is not a party to.
- d. That the said statement caught the attention of the public and has drawn negative reactions from members of the general public.

### STATEMENT OF CLAIM

The Plaintiff claims against the Defendants as follows:

- a. A declaration that the statement made by the Defendant against the Plaintiff and published on The Law Platform online portal stating that;
  - "Transport Minister and his wife dragged to court for 'land grabing' using state security"

    "The Minister for transport and his wife Mrs Wilhemina Asiamah are due for court on Thursday, the 9th of May, 2024 for unlawfully entering and trespassing on land located at the prime and much sought after Tse Addo residential enclave" is defamatory of the Plaintiff.
- b. An order directed at the Defendant to retract the said defamatory statement made about the Plaintiff and published on The Law Platform online portal.
- c. An order directed at the Defendant to publish an apology to the Plaintiff in the following manner;
  - i. By making three(3) publications of the apology on The Law Platform online portal
  - ii. By making one publication in a national daily newspaper

- By posting on the Facebook social media platform with the same prominence the defamatory words received within seven (7) days of the judgment being delivered by this Honourable Court.
- d. General damages against the Defendant in favour of the Plaintiff for the defamatory statement posted by the Defendant on The Law Platform online portal in tune with the reputational value of the Plaintiff as stated in paragraph 6 above.
- e. Aggravated damages against the Defendant for subjecting the Plaintiff to humiliating and malicious circumstances through his defamatory statement against the Plaintiff posted on The Law Platform online portal in tune with the reputational value of the Plaintiff as stated in paragraph 6 above.
- f. Punitive damages against the Defendant in favour of the Plaintiff as punishment for the defamatory statement posted on The Law Platform online portal in tune with the reputational value of the Plaintiff as stated in paragraph 6 above.
- g. Compensatory damages against the Defendant in favour of the Plaintiff for the defamatory statement posted on The Law Platform online portal by the Defendant in tune with the reputational value of the Plaintiff as stated in paragraph 6 above.
- h. Legal costs.
- Any other Orders that this Honourable Court deems fit to make.

#### STATEMENT OF CLAIM

- 1. The Plaintiff is a public servant and serves as the Minister for Transport in Ghana under the cabinet of President Nana Akufo-Addo since February, 2017.
- 2. The Defendant is the lead editor of The Law Platform, an online law magazine that publishes legal content and news on other law related matters.
- 3. The Plaintiff is a very highly respected by many, both locally and abroad especially as the Plaintiff has by virtue of his work as a minister worked with various individuals, bodies, institutions and organs within and outside Ghana.
- 4. The Plaintiff has served as a member of NPP campaign team in the Central Region in 2008, 2012 and 2016. He has been serving as a member of National Council of the New Patriotic Party (NPP) from 2009.
- 5. The Plaintiff was named as part of nineteen ministers who would form the cabinet of the President. As a Cabinet minister, the Plaintiff is part of the inner circle of the President and is to aid in key decision-making activities in the country.
- 6. The Plaintiff says that his reputational value as a result of his professional and public service is worth in excess of Five Million Ghana Cedis (GHC5,000,000.00) at present

Plaintiff says that on the 7<sup>th</sup> of May, 2024, the Defendant published an article fitled "Transport Minister and his wife dragged to court for 'land grabbing' using state security" on The Law Platform website.

8. The Plaintiff says that in the said publication, the following defamatory statements were made of the Plaintiff and his wife;

"Transport Minister and his wife dragged to court for 'land grabing' using state security"

"The Minister for transport and his wife Mrs Wilhemina Asiamah are due for court on Thursday, the 9th of May, 2024 for unlawfully entering and trespassing on land located at the prime and much sought after Tse Addo residential enclave".

- 9. The Plaintiff says that the said publication of the Defendant on his website, The Law Platform, is defamatory of the Plaintiff's hard earned reputation as a public servant with several years of service.
- 10. The Plaintiff avers that in terms of the comments made by the Defendant, pleaded in Paragraph 7 above, the Defendant meant and was understood to mean that the Plaintiff is a criminal, taking forcefully what does not belong to him and the abusing his office as a public officer.
- 11. The Plaintiff states that the statements; "Transport Minister and his wife dragged to court for 'land grabbing' using state security" and "The Minister for transport and his wife Mrs Wilhemina Asiamah are due for court on Thursday, the 9th of May, 2024 for unlawfully entering and trespassing on land located at the prime and much sought after Tse Addo residential enclave" made by the Defendant of the Plaintiff is defamatory.

#### PARTICULARS OF DEFAMATION

- a. That on the 7th of May, 2024, the Defendant published an article titled "Transport Minister and his wife dragged to court for 'land grabbing' using state security" on its website, The Law Platform.
- b. That in the said publication, the following defamatory statements were made of the Plaintiff and his wife;

"Transport Minister and his wife dragged to court for 'land grabbing' using state security"

the Minister for transport and his wife Mrs Wilhemina Asiamah are due for court on Thursday, the 9th of May, 2024 for unlawfully entering and trespassing on land located at the prime and much sought after Tse Addo residential enclave".

- c. That the said statement by the Defendant is about an ongoing land matter which the Plaintiff is not a party to.
- d. That the said statement caught the attention of the public and has drawn negative reactions from members of the general public.
- 12. The Plaintiff avers that the said statement of the Defendant on the Law Platform website has lowered the reputation of the Plaintiff in the estimation of right thinking members of the public.
- 13. The Plaintiff says that the statement by the Defendant is careless and reckless and without any lawful excuse or justification.
- 14. The Plaintiff says that the statements made by the Defendant are entirely malicious.

#### **PARTICULARS OF MALICE**

- a. That on the 7<sup>th</sup> of May, 2024, the Defendant published an article titled "Transport Minister and his wife dragged to court for 'land grabbing' using state security" on its website, The Law Platform.
- b. That in the said publication, the following defamatory statements were made of the Plaintiff and his wife;
- "Transport Minister and his wife dragged to court for 'land grabbing' using state security"
- "The Minister for transport and his wife Mrs Wilhemina Asiamah are due for court on Thursday, the 9<sup>th</sup> of May, 2024 for unlawfully entering and trespassing on land located at the prime and much sought after Tse Addo residential enclave".
- c. That the said statement by the Defendant is without justification and borne out of ill-will and total disregard for the Plaintiff's reputation in society.

plaintiff says that the said defamatory statement was made with the sole intent of reducing him in the estimation of all right thinking persons reading it in Ghana and all over the world.

- 16. The Plaintiff says that after the publication was made, he received several phone calls and messages from his family, friends, colleagues and business associates, who had read the article.
- 17. The Plaintiff says that the Defendant's defamatory statement is a calculated attempt on the part of the Defendant to injure the hard earned reputation of the Plaintiff.
- 18. WHEREFORE the Plaintiff claims against the Defendant as follows;
  - a. A declaration that the statement made by the Defendant against the Plaintiff and published on The Law Platform online portal stating that;
    - "Transport Minister and his wife dragged to court for 'land grabing' using state security"
    - "The Minister for transport and his wife Mrs Wilhemina Asiamah are due for court on Thursday, the 9th of May, 2024 for unlawfully entering and trespassing on land located at the prime and much sought after Tse Addo residential enclave" is defamatory of the Plaintiff.
  - b. An order directed at the Defendant to retract the said defamatory statement made about the Plaintiff and published on The Law Platform online portal.
  - c. An order directed at the Defendant to publish an apology to the Plaintiff in the following manner;
    - i. By making three(3) publications of the apology on The Law Platform online portal
    - ii. By making one publication in a national daily newspaper
    - iii. By posting on the Facebook social media platform with the same prominence the defamatory words received within seven (7) days of the judgment being delivered by this Honourable Court.
  - d. General damages against the Defendant in favour of the Plaintiff for the defamatory statement posted by the Defendant on The Law Platform online
