UPDATE ON ORGANISED LABOUR INDUSTRIAL ACTION OVER SALE OF 60% OF SSNIT'S STAKE IN FOUR HOTELS

The Leadership of Organised Labour, at its emergency meeting held on Monday, 15th July 2024 at the Trades Union Congress (TUC), Accra discussed the decision of SSNIT to terminate the planned sale of SSNIT's share in the four hotels in line with the demand of Organised Labour.

Having had our demands met by the Board of SSNIT, Organised Labour decided to **call off** the ongoing strike. ALL workers are, therefore, directed to report to work **tomorrow**, **Tuesday**, **16th July 2024.** Consequently, the National Executive Council (NEC) of JUSAG wish to inform all staff of the Judicial Service to resume work tomorrow.

Leadership of Organised Labour will engage the Board of SSNIT to resolve any other outstanding issues regarding the management of the Trust.

We wish to express our gratitude to the staff of the Judicial Service and the workers of Ghana for supporting our collective resolve to safeguard our retirement incomes.

PRESS STATEMENT

On Friday, 12th July, 2024, Organised Labour called on all workers to join an indefinite strike action starting from today, Monday, 15th July, 2024 to back its demand for the termination of the process towards the sale of 60% of SSNIT's shares in the four hotels.

In a letter dated 12th July, 2024 (Ref: BC/12/07/2024) SSNIT informed Organised Labour that it has terminated the sale of 60% of its stake in the hotels.

At an emergency meeting held today, Monday, 15th July, 2024, Organised Labour has decided to call off the strike. All workers are requested to resume work on Tuesday, 16th July, 2024.

We are giving SSNIT one month to engage Organised Labour to address all outstanding issues related to the management of our pensions otherwise we advise ourselves.

We thank all the working people of Ghana and all Organised Labour groups for their support.
