### RE: SUSPENSION OF ASSIN CENTRAL CONSTITUENCY SECRETARY FROM HIS POSITION AS NDC CONSTITUENCY SECRETARY

We write on the instructions of **Sadique Broni Yeboah** (our client) of Assin Fosu in the Assin Central Constituency in the Central Region of the Republic of Ghana. Your letter referenced NDC/HQ/69/02/29 and dated 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 2024 has been brought to our notice and it is hereby referred.

Your said letter communicates the decision of the Functional Executive Committee (FEC) seeking to suspend our client on grounds that the purported withdrawal of the Assin Central PC was predicated on *his deliberate misrepresentations and criminal conduct calculated to sabotage the PC and by extension the party.*

Our client is a member of the National Democratic Congress (NDC) hereinafter referred to as “the party” and until your letter referred supra, he was serving as the Assin Central Constituency Secretary. Our client has at all material times been a true Comrade, loyal and dedicated to the principles of the party and has utmost respect for the structures and procedures contained in the Constitution of the party. In the light of this, he instructs us to serve you this letter in order to exhaust the internal complaint/redress mechanisms pursuant to Articles 48 and 49 of the NDC Constitution.

With the greatest respect, our client is scandalized by the decision of FEC to suspend him on findings impugning criminality to his conduct without first giving him a hearing. This is a clear contravention of due process envisaged under Articles 48 and 49 of the party’s Constitution and same infringes on the principles of natural justice to wit: *audi alteram partem* (hear both sides). To this extent, your decision is a complete nullity and void ab initio.
